The International Centre for Tax and Development based in the Governance Cluster at IDS is an international research consortium doing research on issues of taxation and development in Sub-Saharan Africa. We need to recruit a highly competent and motivated Research Officer to join the team and work on at least two key projects in the programme portfolio.

The first project is a large-scale field experiment on tax compliance and the RO will be involved in the design of the experiment and will play a leading role in data analysis. This role will be expected to provide substantial contributions to the research and to co-author at least one of the key outputs.

Under the second project, the RO will lead the compilation of a cross-country dataset of sub-national tax data from at least four countries in Africa. You will need to have a Masters in an Economics/econometrics related field and have significant expertise in STATA.
