### Lord Asa Briggs 1922–2016

Lord Briggs, a distinguished historian and second Vice Chancellor of Sussex University died aged 94 on the 15 March. He was one of Sussex's most active Vice-Chancellors, presiding over the university at a highpoint of its intellectual innovation and reputation. As the historian of the BBC, he brought to the university an extraordinary range of contacts, yet always had time for students and staff, as well as helping to develop the university's approach to "remaking the map of knowledge" when its teaching was organized in schools of African and Asian, European and American studies rather than being organized within disciplinary boundaries. He treasured IDS and was Chair of the Institute's Governing Body, where he encouraged our research and teaching as well as supporting our case with the government and others influential in London. IDS owes much to him and his vision for Sussex.
