Dr Minako Araki, who began her Visiting Fellowship at IDS on 8 May, has extended her stay from December until the end of March 2018. Minako is writing articles based on the SUA Centre for Sustainable Rural Development (SCSRD) project, in particular access to water and sustainable management of water supply facilities, water resources as local commons and collaborative governance among different actors, potentials and obstacles of micro-hydro power in rural Africa and natural energy as a focal point to search for more equal relationship/partnership. Minako will spend mid-April to mid-June at IDS, writing articles based on previous fieldwork, participating in seminars and sharing experience and ideas with people, and from July to September will be undertaking field research in Tanzania. Minako will return to IDS from October to March to analyse data obtained in Tanzania and write articles.
