SUMMARY

Edward Jackson is Honorary Associate of the Institute affiliated with the Business, Markets and the State Research Cluster and the Centre for Development Impact. An evaluator, educator, consultant, and field-builder, he is a specialist in impact investing and blended finance, gender lens investing, entrepreneurship and innovation, local governance, participatory evaluation and research, and community-university partnerships. With extensive experience in West, East and Southern Africa, South and Southeast Asia, and he has advised the MasterCard, McConnell and Rockefeller foundations, the development cooperation programs of Australia, Canada, Denmark and Switzerland, as well as the Caribbean Development Bank, the CDC Group, the German Institute for Development Evaluation, Humanity United, Investing in Women, OECD, World Bank and WUSC. He previously served as a tenured faculty member of public policy and administration, international affairs and African studies, and as Associate Dean (Research and Graduate Affairs) in the Faculty of Public Affairs, at Carleton University, where he co-founded the Carleton Centre for Community Innovation and the Carleton-World Bank International Program for Development Evaluation Training. His recent publications focus on building gender lens investing in Southeast Asia and in the Caribbean, the impact investing ecosystem in Sri Lanka, social enterprise and higher education, and community-campus partnerships for affordable housing in North America. His written work has been cited in more than 150 peer-reviewed journals in a wide range of social-science and public policy fields. Professor Jackson has lectured at Trent, Victoria, Warsaw and Witwatersrand universities, currently holds adjunct professorships at Carleton and Ottawa universities and serves as Senior Research Fellow at the Carleton Centre for Community Innovation. As a volunteer, he serves as Chair of the Diamond Development Initiative Canada, a non-profit working for better livelihoods for artisanal miners in Africa, and advisor to the Coalition of Immokalee Workers and its award-winning Fair Food Program promoting farmworker rights in the United States.
