In her role as a Knowledge Officer and previously as a Nutrition Convenor, Jessica is responsible for the design and delivery of research uptake strategies for large research programme consortia. This includes:

- Project Management of work streams or whole projects with significant focus on tailoring strategies for uptake of the research for improved impact.
- Centring the work on the target audience, understanding their needs and preferences when designing strategies for influence.
- Conducting and training 'Network Mapping' methodology.
- Hosting stakeholder events to encourage the use of evidence in decision making for policies and programmes.
- Reflective learning on 'what works' for policy influence and impact.
- Using innovative methods for packaging and communicating research.
- Writing and editing research and policy briefs.
- Conducting literature and evidence reviews both within nutrition and policy influence.
- Synthesising evidence on nutrition specific and nutrition sensitive actions, in particular the linkages between agriculture and nutrition and the evidence for multi-sectoral coordination.
- Lecturing on the causes and consequences of malnutrition.
- Design and delivery of nutrition and advocacy training for the SUN CSN.
- Budget management and donor reporting.

Selected project examples:

Jessica worked as the **Research Uptake Manager** for the multi-partner research programme consortium, **Leveraging Agriculture for Nutrition in South Asia**. She was responsible for the development of the research uptake strategy which was based on extensive stakeholder engagement, understanding barriers and facilitators to accessing and using evidence in decision making, network and policy mapping. The strategy including tailored activities for each country context.

Jessica was the **lead for three work streams** within the Irish Aid funded **AgriDiet** programme. Jessica led on a global evidence review on agriculture and nutrition linkages and was responsible for the development and delivery of knowledge mobilisation strategies and stakeholder platforms. The strategies were developed to respond to local stakeholders needs and actively engage them in the update and application of research knowledge.
