OVERVIEW

Dr. Tony Roberts is a Research Fellow in the Digital and Development team at the Institute of Development Studies. He has been working at the intersection of social justice, digital technologies and international development since 1988 as a volunteer, practitioner, trustee, lecturer and researcher. After lecturing for four years in New Technology and Education at the University of East London, Tony founded and directed two international development agencies. He led Coda International and then Computer Aid International for more than a decade each. Tony then consolidated 25 years of field experience and learning into doctoral research with women experiencing gender injustice in Zambia employing participatory video and participatory action research. He joined IDS after one year as a Research Fellow in the Gender Technology Lab of the United Nations University, Computing and Society research institute (UNU-CS). His research focuses on participation, power and technology as means to social justice and equitable development and has been published in the form of peer-reviewed journal articles, book chapters, conference papers and book reviews.
