OVERVIEW

Naomi Vernon is the Programme and Communications Manager for the <u>Sanitation Learning Hub</u> (SLH) at the Institute of Development Studies (IDS), and has worked for over a decade developing participatory research and learning programmes to support the WASH sector. SLH facilitates timely, relevant and actionable research and learning activities in the water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) sector, drawing attention to knowledge gaps, blind spots and emerging questions to help the WASH sector navigate complex issues and take action. Naomi is responsible for the strategic management of the programme, overseeing: the strategic development and evolution of the programme, including decision-making over programmatic activities; financial management; donor and stakeholder relationships and networking; fundraising; and developing and leading monitoring, evaluation and learning (MEL) processes to ensure outcomes of research and learning activities are identified, lessons are learned and fed into ongoing programmatic learning and adaptation. She has also been responsible for the editorial leadership and development of <u>SLH publication series</u>' and studies, producing practical, action-orientated outputs and raising the profile of neglected gender, equity and social inclusion (GESI) issues. She has authored a number of outputs including a well-received book, <u>Sustainable Sanitation for All.</u> She has also supported capacity strengthening of WASH programme and research staff e.g. to develop their own writing and communication skills to encourage documentation and dissemination of learning.
