OVERVIEW

Jodie Thorpe leads the Business, Markets & State cluster and Business and Development Centre at IDS, with over 15 years' experience delivering research, policy analysis and consultancy in this field. Her work explores the relationships between market actors, and between the market and the state, to understand what drives business investment that is more or less inclusive, and how these relationships impact development outcomes. She is interested in the governance processes and institutional structures that mediate state-business interactions, both formal arrangements and informal networks. Her work has focused predominately in the food and agriculture sectors, with country-level experience in Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ghana, Ethiopia, Myanmar, Nepal, Uganda and South Africa.

SELECTED RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

2020 - PRESENT Reimagining Infrastructure: how marginalised people's food and nutrition security is shaped by a continuum of infrastructure assemblages Methodological lead for market systems component of GCRF/ESCR funded research taking place in 'off-grid' settings in five cities in Asia and Africa. The research asks how marginalised people's food and nutrition security is shaped by physical infrastructure availability as well as the social and political relationships and ideologies operating and influencing access to urban infrastructure. The market systems component is providing a structured analysis of the flow

of key foods consumed by marginal urban residents and how these are shaped by urban infrastructure assemblages at multiple levels.

Business Environment Reform, Gender and Inclusion

Study lead for analysis of the relationship between business licensing reform and gender inclusion in Indonesia. The study develop a theoretical framework setting out hypothesized relationships between reform and gender, and then used secondary data from the World Bank Enterprise Survey to assess the effect of business licensing reform on firm performance and the variation in these effects by gender of management and location of firms. Based on the results, recommendations were developed to inform the Global Business Environment Programme under FCDO's Prosperity Fund.

2019 - 2020 **Compliance of Edible Oil and Salt Fortification with National Standards in Bangladesh** Study lead for project component designed to understand what drives firm decision-making along the salt and edible oil value chains, leading to differential outcomes in fortification compliance in Bangladesh. The study assessed how the distribution of incentives, share of value, business relationships, costs and risks, and broader institutional factors affect value chain dynamics, with recommendations designed to strengthen compliance and maximize public health outcomes. The research was commissioned by the Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN). Additional funding was provided to produce policy and journal articles in order to share the findings more widely.

2019 - 2020 Gender Inclusion and Investing for Brazilian SGBs in the Creative Economy

Project lead in collaboration with the Aspen Network of Development Entrepreneurs (ANDE) in Brazil. The project engaged Brazil's social and creative enterprise and small and growing business (SGB) ecosystem in support of gender inclusion. Through workshops and webinars, the project supported impact investors and intermediaries working with social and creative enterprises on gender lens investing, incubation and acceleration. The work was part of the British Council's Developing Inclusive and Creative Economies (DICE) programme.

2019 Enterprise development approaches in E4D/SOGA's theory of change Co-lead for research informing GIZ's E4D/SOGA programme, which aims to generate employment through SME development in natural resource industries in East Africa. In addition to a theoretical review of enterprise development and job creation, and a review of private sector development programmes, the project used process tracing to identify causal mechanisms of jobs and income generation from enterprise development projects in Uganda and Kenya. Invited to further present this learning at a closed meeting of GIZ economic development advisers in Africa.

2017 - 2020 Linking Participation and Economic Advancement

Co-led research in collaboration with the Economic Advancement Program at the Open Society Foundations on participation in economic governance. Led work to build an evidence base through mapping and co-inquiry with OSF, its partners and others in this field, to identify and analyse existing initiatives and experiences. The aim was to identify how meaningful participation in economic governance can occur - and challenges be overcome - in business decision-making, government economic policymaking as well as grassroots economic alternatives.

2017 - 2020 Business Investment in Agricultural Commercialisation

Co-lead for study exploring the effectiveness of policies designed to incentivise business investment in African agriculture. The research identified both which policy incentives are most effective at driving investment (more, faster, different), and which commercialisation pathways are promoted, considering investment in input supply, production and processing. Field work focused on Ghana, Ethiopia and Malawi. Invited to give evidence to House of

2017 - 2018 **Private Sector Development in Countries Progressing to Peace and Prosperity** Delivered country analyses of Myanmar and Nepal in project advising DFID on supporting private sector development in conflict-affected middle- and lower-middle-income countries. The findings offered evidence, conclusions and recommendations for donors in developing PSD strategies for countries progressing towards peace and prosperity.

2016 - 2017 Changing State-Business Relations in Developing Countries

Project lead for research exploring state-business relations in the era of the SDGs. The research assessed state-business interactions and implications for development outcomes. The findings highlighted processes (agency, patterns of exchange, ideas and ideologies) and structures (power relations and formal and informal institutions) that shape negotiations between state and business, and provided an agenda for future analysis and research.

2016 - 2017 Pathways to Inclusive Development through Innovation, Technology and Structural Change

Research co-lead with the Science Policy Research Unit (SPRU) at the University of Sussex on pathways through which innovation in product, process, organisation and market contributes to economic development, and the implications for poverty and inequality. The research developed conceptual and measurement frameworks, and an extensive literature and case review on technological innovation, structural change and inclusion.

2015 - 2016 Market Based Solutions for the Extreme Poor

IDS lead for research funded by the Rockefeller Foundation exploring market-based solutions that reach and benefit those facing extreme marginalisation due to factors such as gender, caste, disability, ethnicity or HIV-status. Led the work to document cases of innovation and develop a typology of promising market-based solutions. The research led to follow up work for the BEAM Exchange on market systems approaches and 'leaving no one behind', as well as a request for follow on support and guidance from SDC.

2014 - 2017 BEAM (Building Effective and Accessible Markets) Exchange

Research lead for the BEAM Exchange, a knowledge platform on market systems approaches to poverty reduction. Designed the research programme, commissioned and quality assured research, and facilitated engagement between academics and practitioners, as well as delivering research in areas such as women's empowerment and nutrition. BEAM has become widely known and highly appreciated as a core learning platform within the market systems community.

2013 - 2015 **PPPs in Agriculture: Enabling Factors and Impact on the Rural Poor** Research lead for IFAD-funded research on key factors driving the effectiveness of PPPs at bringing sustained increases in income for smallholder farmers and delivering rural development, based on in-depth case studies of IFAD-financed PPPs in Ghana, Indonesia, Rwanda and Uganda. Recruited and managed four country researchers, participating in primary research, analysis and report preparation.
