OVERVIEW

Niranjan worked on the FCDO-funded 'Action for Accountability and Empowerment' (A4EA) programme and ESRC-funded 'Learning on the Street' project at IDS. He is currently working on projects related to governance and social protection in Bangladesh, education advocacy in challenging contexts, and citizen action to improve condition of racialised minorities in UK, Brazil and Canada. His research interests include understanding citizen-state relations, advocacy and collective action for government and corporate accountability. Before joining IDS, Niranjan worked on rights-based advocacy for health and education with grassroots organisations in India.
